2. About Pragjyotishpur University

2.1. THE SPONSORING BODY: SERF

The Shankardev Education and Research Foundation (SERF) is a trust formally established on Sunday, the 22nd of August 2021, at Guwahati, Assam. It is a voluntary organisation that envisions quality higher education along with inculcation of the sense of Bharatiya life values in students. The SERF aims to work on two fronts for realising its objectives:

1. Developing educational institutions.
2. Collaborating with educational institutions.

As a part of its first objective, Pragjyotishpur University has come into being with the enactment of the Pragjyotishpur University Act No. XLVI of 2022 by the Government of Assam. Today, the SERF is the Sponsoring Body of the University.

Immediately after its establishment, the SERF, taking a step towards its second objective, conducted a series of academic deliberations and knowledge dissemination exercises. The outcome was the Two-Day North-East Education Conclave 2021, which was organised from 20-21 November 2021 at Guwahati Medical College & Hospital Auditorium and at Assam Administrative Staff College, Guwahati. The conclave aimed to illustrate the basic premise of NEP 2020, its challenges, and experiences related to its implementation in some of the major states in Bharat.

This was the biggest Education Conclave in Northeast Bharat in recent years and was attended by many personalities of note: among them, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam, Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma; the Union Minister for Education, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan; five education ministers from the states of Manipur, Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, and Assam; representatives of the Education Ministers of Nagaland, Mizoram, and Tripura; and resource persons from various reputed organisations such as the AICTE, the NCERT, the NCTE, the UGC, IIMs, IITs, Central Universities, colleges, and schools.

Going ahead, the SERF organised the Pragjyotishpur Literature Festival 2023, an extraordinary literary extravaganza held from 29 September-1 October 2023 in Guwahati. The LitFest was aimed at familiarising and bonding the people of Bharat with the rich literary heritage of Northeast Bharat. It was also aimed at giving youth of the region an occasion to tap

into and become more aware of their own impressions regarding their roots in their cultures and literary traditions.

2.2. THE UNIVERSITY

The name ‘Pragjyotishpur’ connotes rays of primordial light and, in ancient times, signified the geographic area that spans much of what is Northeast Bharat today. This name has been mentioned even in texts as old as the *Rāmāyaṇa* and the *Mahābhārata*.

Honouring the rich and vibrant legacy associated with this name, Pragjyotishpur University came into being on Monday, the 17th of October 2022, with the enactment of the Pragjyotishpur University Act No. XLVI of 2022 by the Government of Assam.

Pragjyotishpur University was founded with a resolve to nurture a centre of world-class education and research driven by a cross-cutting approach for overcoming barriers to knowledge creation, sustenance, and dissemination. Each and every corner of this university rings with the rhythm of the true essence of *Jñāna* (knowledge), *Prajñā* (wisdom), and *Satya* (truth), three principles explicitly incorporated in the mandate of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Pragjyotishpur University echoes the muse of the famous saying of the Gita, invoking the essence of true knowledge by seeking to create brave, compassionate, dedicated, firm, patriotic, and steady human beings through inculcation of a sense of *Aikya* (unity), *Anuśāsana* (discipline), *Dhairya* (patience), *Karunā* (compassion), *Satyānvēṣaṇa* (quest for truth), and *Śraddhā* (reverence) in learners. Thus, this unique academic institution will imbibe in the minds of learners such qualities as accountability, dedication, innovation, openness of mind, patriotism, scientific temper, social responsibility, and transparency.

2.6. BEST PRACTICES

The best practices of the University include its research and academic plans as well as a horizontal-cum-vertical model of incorporation of content from Bhāratīya Jñana Paramparā or Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) in course curricula.

- a. **Research Plan:** Faculty members shall be encouraged to conduct research on different trending and important topics. All faculty members are to maintain a progress card of their research work. The Vice-Chancellor of the University shall monitor the progress of the research work by faculty once a week.
- b. **Academic Plan:** All faculty members shall regularly create comprehensive study materials for their classes. Faculty members are encouraged to implement the best pedagogies while delivering content for their classes. Every faculty member is to maintain a progress card of his/her teaching goals. The Vice-Chancellor of the University shall monitor the progress of teaching-learning activities by faculty once a week.

- c. **Bhāratīya Jñāna Paramparā (IKS) in curricula:** Every discipline's curriculum shall place sufficient emphasis on IKS. The course curriculum of every discipline shall include at least 5% of content about Bhāratīyatā, according to NEP 2020. The implementation of IKS shall follow a horizontal-cum-vertical model in the curriculum: horizontal implementation of IKS will be in the form of introduction of subjects such as Bharat Bodh; vertical implementation shall come through incorporation of units/topics across discipline-specific courses in a way that establishes connections between the present-day corpus of knowledge and its parallels in IKS.
